


## Learning about plant life cycles, plant food and more!

Numeracy

This term we are focusing on "I quantify my world".

Through play and planned activities we are encouraging children to:

- Notice and use numbers to describe quantities
- Number games and stories at group times
- Patterning and sorting making "sets" of numbers
- Dice rolling games and looking at numbers in the environment.
   Literacy

This term we are focusing on "I use language to connect with my world".


Through stories and games we encourage children to:

- Participate with others, share ideas, use literacy in their play, listening to the ideas of others.
- Rhyming
- Book making with the children

Children who are able to listen to and interpret stories are demonstrating literacy skills which will benefit story writing and reading in the future.

Aboriginal education

At the beginning of our morning group time, we do an Acknowledgement of Country in the Kaurna language—We will be gradually introducing more Kaurna words and phrases, so don't be surprised if your child comes home with some unfamiliar words!

Nature Education Centre:

We have organised to borrow some animals again this term from the Nature Education Centre. For weeks 3 and 4 we have the hopping mice and then 5 and 6 is the bearded dragon.

Angela has started some woodwork with the children. We have done a risk assessment on how to use the tools and she is working with the children to hammer nails into some materials onto pieces of wood. These woodwork creations will start coming home soon.

We are seeking regular supplies of untreated pine/soft timber offcuts for our woodwork table.



#### Mid-year Intake:

The government is introducing a mid-year intake to preschool in 2023 and to reception in 2024. You may be aware that, based on estimated mid-year enrolments at our preschool and growth in our local community, we were planning to partner with Stradbroke School to run a pilot program of preschool children starting reception mid-year this year.

We can now advise you that, based on our current mid-year enrolments, this pilot program will not be proceeding.

The mid-year intake children will now be coming to Kindy on Fridays and one other day during the week. We have started planning for them to come in and we will have visits for the new children during weeks 9 and 10 this term.

#### Fees:

#### Reminders: Parking

We ask families to not use the car park outside the Kindergarten to drop off and pick up children as it can create a safety issue with children coming in and out. If you have a circumstance where you require a disabled car park please speak to staff so we can help accommodate your needs.

#### **Emergency Evacuation**

Next week (weather permitting) we are planning on practicing our emergency evacuation again with the children. We will walk to Stradbroke school and do a roll call and them come back to Kindy again.

### What did you do at Kindy today?

It can be common for young children to find difficulty in answering the question "what did you do at Kindy today?" At kindy we focus on the process of learning rather than the end product.

Open ended questions like "tell me where you played inside" or "I wonder if ...." or questions that start with "what, how, why or where " tend to be good conversation starters.

There are also lots of ways you can stay informed about what is happening at Kindy. We have our program displayed on the window, newsletters, our floor book on the easel near the entrance, and the seesaw app and each child has their individual learning folder.

We welcome a quick informal chat any time or if you have concerns you can make a time to speak with staff. This term we will be writing mid-year statements of learning that will include future planning to meet the individual needs of each child. We are hoping to discuss these with families before the end of this term,
