Exploring Number








Vicki's group explored the concept of 10 frames. The children roll the dice and place the loose parts inside the frame. This encourages the children to:

visualize what a number looks like Count—putting the object in the space Subitising—knowing that the top and

In Rachel's group children are learning to recognise the patterns in collections of dots—for example the patterns of dots on a dice. The children rolled the dice and recorded using tally marks how many times that number came up.

In Angela's group the children went fishing for objects with the numbers on the back and they matched those numbers to the card with that

number of dots.

Tina's group we played number bingo. The children counted out their counters using 1 to 1 correspondence. Then the teacher called out the numbers 1—20 and the children recognised the numbers and found it on their card. They also counted how many they had left before they called out "Bingo".
