Term 3 is flying past I cant believe it is already week 4! We welcome all the new families who have started in the mid-year intake. It is great to see how well they have all settled in. The current children have also been fantastic role models helping with routines and making them feel welcome. We have been talking at group times about being a friend and introducing our protective behaviours curriculum for this term talking about our bodies and personal space. If you want more information there is a link for families on our website to the child protection curriculum.

It was great to listen to Trent's artefact talk this week and we followed this up by talking about cooking food on the fire. We had a fire pit on Tuesday and Wednesday and we cooked damper. The damper turned out really tasty. There is a copy of the recipe below:

Damper Recipe

450g (3 cups) self-raising flour

Pinch of salt

80g butter

185ml (3/4 cup) water

Preheat oven to 200C. Combine the flour and salt in a large bowl. Use your fingertips to rub the butter into the flour until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add the water to the flour mixture and use a round bladed knife to mix until it comes together. Add 1-2 tablespoons extra water if its dry.

Turn the dough onto a lightly floured surface and knead gently for 1-2 mins or until smooth. Shape into an 18cm disc and place on a tray.

Bake in preheated oven for 30mins or until the damper is cooked through and sounds hollow when tapped on the base.

Serve warm or room temperature.












BOOK WEEK 2023


Fundraising—Pavers

Indigenous Culture for kids

Trent came to Kindy today to share with us some history and how the Aboriginal people lived and hunted and how they looked after the land by being sustainable, they would move around from place to place often so the environment had time to regrow and reproduce.

He talked about the tools and instruments they made like spears and boomerangs that they used for hunting kangaroos, emus, goannas and ducks.

He bought in Artefacts boomerangs, bowls, tapping sticks, digging sticks, his fire sticks and a didgeridoo that he played.

Trent showed us how they would use kangaroo skins to carry water, food, put their tools in, it is soft and warm to carry a baby, it was used for clothes, blankets and also shelter.

We learnt a lot about the Indigenous culture
