This is the second newsletter for the year and it seems as if the children have all settled into the routines of Kindy well and are showing us they are all keen to learn which is great! They are learning each others names and it has been great to see them all engaging in social games in the boat, home corner and sandpit.

Lunar New Year has been fun to celebrate with the children. They have done their own Lion dance at group times and made Lanterns to decorate the Kindy which looks amazing. 2024 is the year of the Golden Dragon.

Have a look at the program on the window outside by the children's sign in sheet. It changes every fortnight. We are following up from our summer planting with Rebecca by doing observational drawing of the carrot seed and the children will get to take home their own packet to grow at and observe at home.

Gardening -

Rebecca Mumford from Greenhill Living

Rebecca Mumford is coming throughout the year to build on our food garden education program. This term's sessions are about introducing children to gardening, learning about the life cycle of a carrot plant and insects we might find in the garden. She has created a series of books and introduces "Gaye the Garden Girl" which is available if families want to read them with their child at Kindy. We will be taking observations of the garden throughout the term and watching carefully as our carrot seeds and other seedlings grow. (EYLF outcome 1: Children have a strong sense of identity – children learn to interact in relation to others with care, empathy and respect)

Emergency Evacuation

A constant discussion is our protective behaviours curriculum around feelings, safe and unsafe behaviour and emergencies. We will be practicing our emergency evacuation to Stradbroke School once we have received permission from all the families. We also talk to the children about how we use the equipment safely at Kindy. So far we have had discussions about being safe on and around the swings and one at time on the slide and how to move around Kindy safely with Scissors. We are also having discussions at group times around being a good friend and how we can keep ourselves and others safe at Kindy.

Family Information Sheets

Thank you to the families who have already brought back their family information sheets and the "all about me" A3 pages. The children love sharing their page with the group. We would really appreciate if families can still please fill out the Information sheets We find this information very valuable and we use it to help with our future planning. We have been looking at families and the children have made houses and drawn a picture of the people who live in their house. These are displayed at the entrance on the window, the children have also completed



their portrait of themselves for this term. Each term they do a portrait which we put in the frames on the wall

inside. It is wonderful to see how the portraits progress over their time at Kindy. These portraits are also going to be on the seesaw app.

Literacy and Numeracy Indicators at Preschool
Literacy: I use language to connect with my world
Our Literacy focus this term is about encouraging children to
communicate and express their ideas through conversations, asking
questions and listening. We have set up story tables with a focus book
and read stories to the children each day.
Numeracy:

This term we are focusing on: Explore symbols and patterns in my environment

Identify and talk about shapes and properties Investigate same and different

Over the next four weeks we have planned many experiences to help children gain an understanding of shapes and their properties. We have planned shape hunts, shape bingo, making shape pictures and using playdough and natural materials to make shape designs. We have read shape books and play shape games. Hopefully you will start hearing some of this mathematical shape language at home. Twice a week we have focused small groups, for the next 4 week we are focusing on exploring shapes and patterns.

ADOPTED ORANGUTAN POPI



Our adoption of Popi will help her to find her jungle freedom by supporting jungle school training, food and medical costs and intensive post-release monitoring to ensure that they are both safe and thriving in their true jungle home.

Little Popi was confiscated from a family in the Sempayau village in East Kalimantan in September 2016 by the Centre for Orangutan Protection. This village is near a palm oil plantation. It is highly likely that Popi's mother was killed by palm oil plantation workers and then sold illegally as a pet. She was estimated to be only eight weeks of age when she was rescued Popi had no teeth and would often cry. Orangutan infants rely solely on their mother for nutrition and comfort. Popi would have been highly traumatised from losing her mother and then held in totally unsuitable conditions as a pet. As well her full-time carer and two vets helped to look after tiny Popi.

Over the next few weeks we will start our focus on yarning together to learn about Orangutans and their habitat.

<u>Pancakes</u>

1 1/2 cups of Plain flour

1 tbsp baking powder

1/2 tsp salt

2 tbsp sugar

1 cup of soy milk

1/2 cup water

2 tbsp of olive oil



Mix all the dry ingredients together in a bowl, add the wet ingredients and whisk until all the ingredients are combined together. Cook until golden in colour.
